

# GEORGIA VOTERS' VIEWS ON REDISTRICTING 2026 POLL RESULTS

## KEY FINDINGS

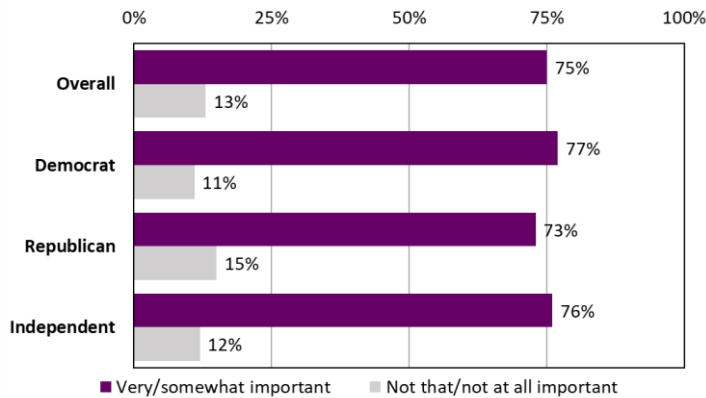
Georgia voters want:

- Overwhelming majority of voters (75%) want competitive elections.
- Large majority (60%) want maps to reflect demographic diversity.
- A majority would ban redrawing maps before the next ten-year census.
- A significant and growing majority (64%) favor non-partisan map drawing.

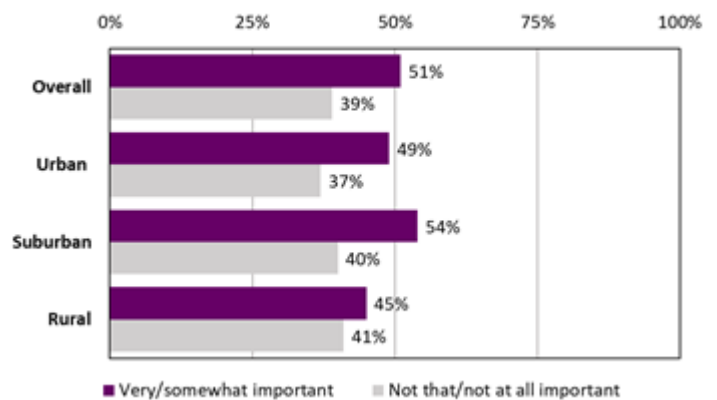

How important is it to you that Georgia's election maps...

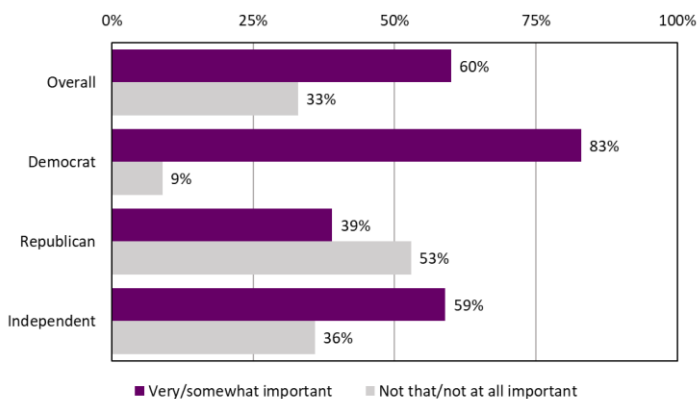
**Prioritize competitive districts: by party**



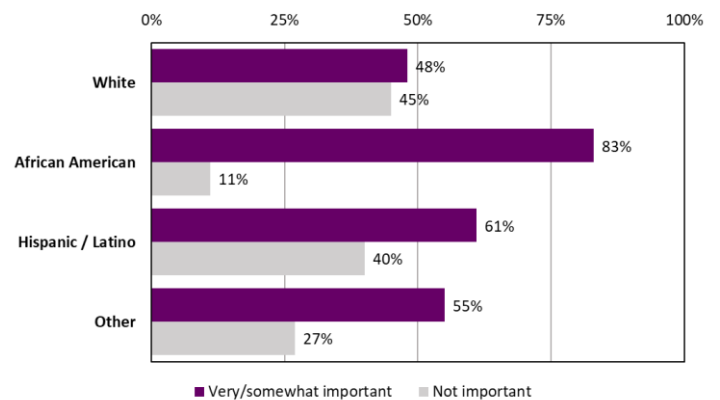
**Keep "communities of interest" together: by residence**



**Reflect the state's racial diversity: by party**



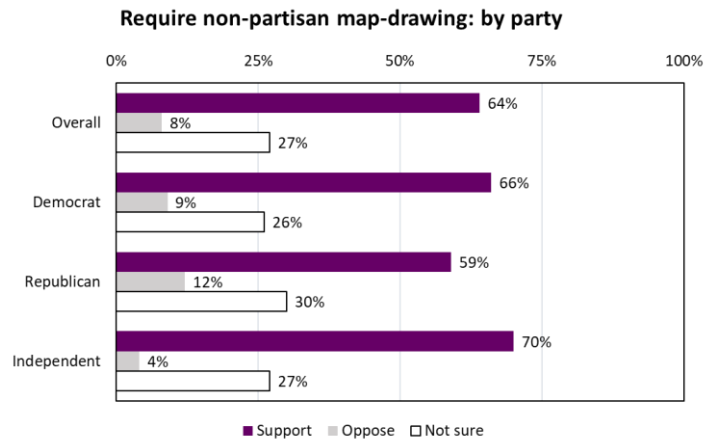
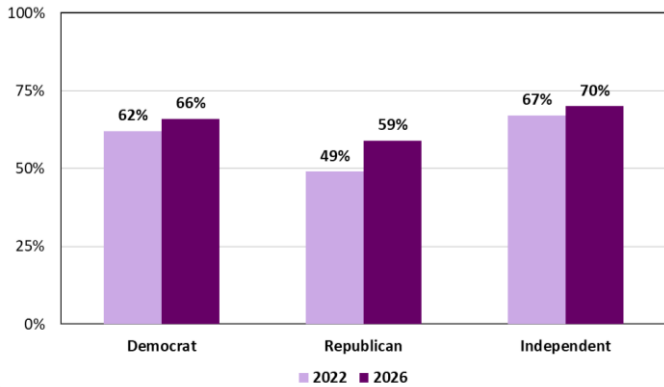

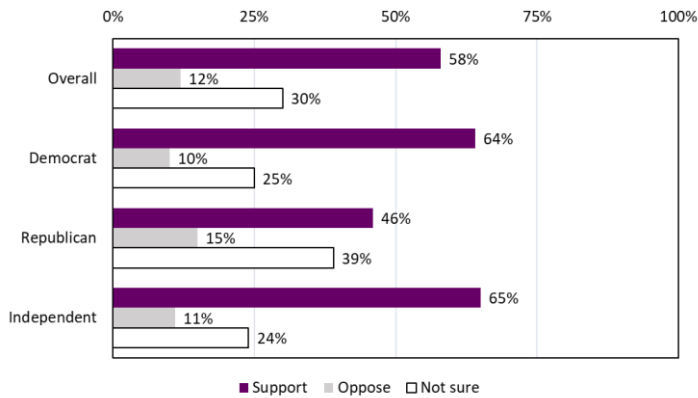
Support is growing for a law to require non-partisan map drawing.

Would you support or oppose a law to...

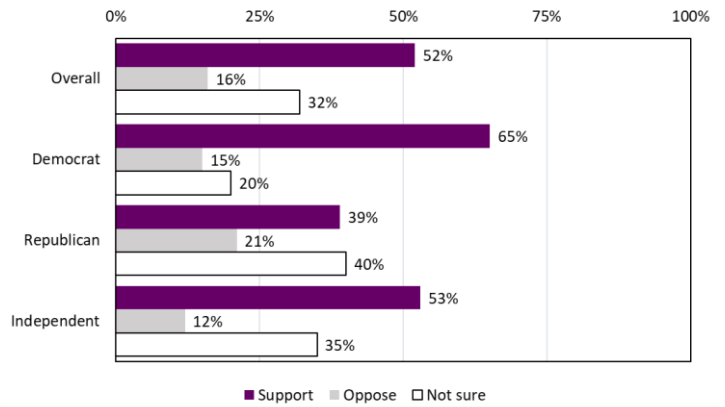


Would you support or oppose a law to...

Require independent commission draw maps: by party

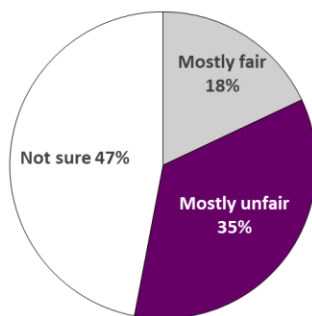


Ban mid-decade redistricting: by party

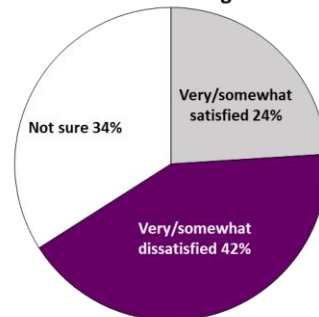


Confidence in the fairness of current maps and satisfaction with the map-drawing process are low.
